Subject: Competitiveness Council / Unified Patent Court Agreement

As representatives of Europe's SME community, we urge all countries involved to do everything possible to enable the swift ratification of the Unified Patent Court Agreement, which is on the agenda of the Competitiveness Council on 29 September.

We will not provide a detailed explanation of the merits of effective unitary patent protection, with which you are of course by now familiar. It is, however, worth underlining the exponential advantages to SMEs in terms of legal certainty, administrative simplification, reduced costs for the protection of innovations and economies of scale in general.

There are many ways in which the single market remains incomplete to SMEs, but the ratification and entry into force of the UPCA - a key factor in the delivery of a reformed and more efficient European patent system - is tantalisingly within reach.


On behalf of Europe's innovative SMEs, we call on ministers and officials to do everything possible on 29 September to ensure that this process crosses the finishing line in the immediate future and does not, after all these years of discussion, again become engulfed in broader discussions.
