## Global Chamber Platform rejects protectionism and calls for greater inclusiveness in trade

The Global Chamber Platform (GCP) has called on heads of state and government to convey a clear message against unjustified trade barriers, protectionism and populism at the 2017 G20 Summit. This was made clear in a statement adopted at the 15th annual gathering of the GCP in Berlin today. The GCP will continue to actively raise its concerns during the B20 Business Summit today and tomorrow, thus feeding into the G20 process.

"International trade has led to the creation of millions of jobs in the European Union during the last decade. The growing economic interdependence of different countries has also ensured the preservation of peace and wealth. Whoever advocates protectionism and isolation puts all of this at risk," warned GCP Chairman, Christoph Leitl, who is also the Honorary President of EUROCHAMBRES.

In its statement, the Global Chamber Platform also stresses that further steps have to be taken to make trade policy fairer and more inclusive. Support for less qualified workers is also key. "We have to help those who see themselves as losers from globalisation. A major difference could be made by creating new opportunities through enhanced vocational training and skills development, as well as by increasing the mobility of workers", underlined Leitl.

Measures must also be taken to ensure that SMEs can benefit from international opportunities. "The GCP calls upon the heads of government and state of the G20 to commit themselves, in particular in the framework of the WTO, to advance the needs of SMEs on the multilateral level through concrete initiatives", said Leitl.
