EUROCHAMBRES highlights need to remove tax barriers to Commissioner Kovács

In a meeting with Taxation and Customs Commissioner László Kovács yesterday, EUROCHAMBRES' President Christoph Leitl highlighted that taxation policy plays a vital role in enhancing European competitiveness. For Chambers the need for a fair competition of tax rates and an accelerated removal of tax barriers is of utmost importance.

Mr Leitl especially raised concerns regarding the current burden for SMEs. He said: "SMEs suffer from disproportionate tax compliance costs — e.g. accounting, documentation, registration - and from the lengthy procedures. Furthermore, some Member States delay the reimbursement of VAT for a very long time which puts a serious cash-flow burden on small and medium enterprises. Projects such as 'Home State Taxation' and 'VAT one stop shop' are a step in the right direction, but the devil lies in the detail. Therefore, Chambers should be already involved at an early stage when such schemes are being developed."

EUROCHAMBRES offered the Commissioner the Chambers' expertise in taxation matters. Due to their regional focus, Chambers can provide bottom-up knowledge which is crucial in this regard.

European Chambers urge the Commission and Member States to

- support the Home State Taxation pilot project; If SMEs have to fulfil only the requirements of the Home State - and not of all states where they have affiliates cross border economic activities would be promoted and contribute to economic growth;
- simplify the intra-EU VAT system; bureaucratic procedures are time consuming and bind capital which could be re-invested for economic activities;
- develop a 'referential' EU tax base, which Member States could then voluntarily apply; this would constitute a benchmark for a transparent tax comparison.

In order to enhance commitment at national level Chambers already urged heads of government to implement measures that help to minimise tax payment costs for SMEs.
