

EU Summit next week critical for businesses and jobs

On the day that European Council President, Charles Michel, presented revised proposals for the European long-term budget and the recovery plan, EUROCHAMBRES has underlined the gravity of the situation for many businesses as the economic impact of COVID-19 continues.

The European Commission's new summer economic forecasts predict an even greater 8.3% contraction of the EU economy than previously estimated. And behind these headline figures, Chambers across Europe are supporting thousands of individual businesses struggling to survive.
